

**ATCP 160.56 - HORSE AND PONY – DEPARTMENT 6**  
**Judging: Tuesday, 8:30 a.m. – Infield of Race Track**

Regulations – See health regulations in front of book. Green County also requires vaccination for Eastern and Western equine encephalomyelitis, tetanus, influenza and coggins test. Your original coggins test and a copy needs to be presented before unloading at the fairgrounds. Check in with superintendents upon arrival.

Horse and Pony Size Classification

- a. Horse – 56 inches and over      b. Pony – under 56 inches

Horse and Pony Rules and Instructions

1. **ONE** lot must be chosen from Class A - Showmanship or Class C - Horsemanship for a premium
2. A **second** premium must be chosen from Class B - Pleasure or Class D - Trail.
3. **Exhibitors with two animals may be awarded up to three premiums total** – one premium in Class A – Showmanship or Class C – Horsemanship and one premium per horse in Class B (Western or English pleasure) or Class D - Trail
4. Exhibitors of immediate family sharing an animal may each enter separate showmanship or horsemanship classes for a premium. However, the horse can only be exhibited once by an exhibitor for a premium in English Pleasure, Western Pleasure, or Trail.
5. **Exhibitors MUST indicate whether they are showing one to two horses on their fair entry form.**
6. All exhibitors are to wear a SEI safety approved helmet while on their horse/pony.
7. No stallions can be shown except foals of current year.
8. State 4-H rules apply where applicable.
9. 4-H and FFA exhibitors are encouraged to attend the annual Kick Off meeting held in February to learn the most current information for the upcoming project season.
10. Each horse/pony and exhibitor must have Picture ID and current year negative Coggins test. Picture ID's, contracts and Coggin's paperwork is due to the UW-Extension office by May 1<sup>st</sup>. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
11. Exhibitors can identify up to three (3) owned or leased horses/ponies by the May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. Exhibitors can show a maximum of 2 horses/ponies, of which one (1) can be a leased horse.
12. Exhibitors must have a Premise ID number listed for each horse identified and also on their fair entry form to exhibit t the Green County Fair.
13. Exhibitors must have attended at least (2) Green County horse clinics. At least one must be with an exhibitor's horse/pony. Exhibitors will need to have their educational requirement form completed and turned in to the UWEX office by the end of June to stay in compliance for the fair show.

14. Exhibitors must report to judging **on time!** If a tack change is required, show officials must be notified. In an exhibitor must scratch from a lot number, the gate person or Supt. Must be notified prior to that lot number entering the ring.
15. Horses/Ponies cannot be groomed, ridden, driven or schooled by anyone other than the exhibitor once the horse is unloaded at the fairgrounds. However, family may assist exhibitors with grooming and tacking up their horses. No coaching allowed from outside the ring.
16. Good Sportsmanship shall prevail at all times by exhibitors, family members and spectators.
17. Green County Fair blue ribbon winners from state qualifying classes who are 4-H program members in grades 6 through 13 of the current project year (January 1<sup>st</sup>) are eligible to exhibit at the State 4-H Horse Expo in September. The state qualifying classes are trail, driving, horsemanship, equitation, pleasure, (NO Bareback) and showmanship.
18. State Horse show qualifiers must register for the State Horse Show at the Extension Office no later than the Friday after the County Fair Horse Show.
19. It is recommended that members exhibiting that are in grades 8 and younger be accompanied by a parent or a responsible adult.

**CLASS A - SHOWMANSHIP**  
 (Danish Judging)

*To be judged on the ability of the exhibitor to show at halter. Grooming and fitting of the horse are to be considered. Only one showmanship class may be entered per exhibitor for a premium. Cannot show in showmanship if planning on showing in Horsemanship classes.*

**CLASS B - PLEASURE**  
 (Danish Judging)

*Animal judged on its performance as a pleasure mount or a pleasure drive.*

1. Pleasure Driving Pony or Horse, any age, grade or registered
6. English Pleasure Horse, Grades 3-6
7. English Pleasure Horse, Grades 7-9
8. English Pleasure Horse, Grades 10 and up
9. English Pleasure Pony , Grades 3 and above
11. Western Pleasure Horse Grades 3-6
12. Western Pleasure Horse, Grades 7-9

13. Western Pleasure Horse, Grades 10 and up
14. Western Pleasure Pony, Grades 3 and above

**CLASS C – HORSEMANSHIP**  
(Danish Judging)

*Judged on the exhibitor’s ability to drive or ride. Cannot enter horsemanship classes if planning on showing same horse in showmanship.*

**CLASS D – TRAIL CLASS**  
(Danish Judging)

1. Trail Class, Grades 3-6
2. Trail Class, Grades 7-9
3. Trail Class, Grades 10 and up
4. Trail at Halter (may not enter if entering riding trail class)  
Champion Trail ..... ribbon

**CLASS E – HALTER CLASS**

*To be judged on the conformation of the horse or pony  
No cross entering classes 1-6. Exhibitors can only enter each animal in one halter class.*

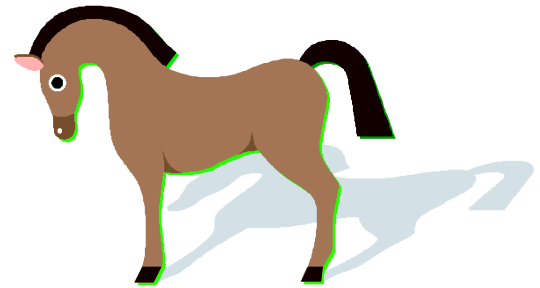

**CLASS F – OTHER CLASSES**  
**(Ribbon Judging 1-6 – No Premiums)**

1. Costume Class, Grades 3-7 ..... Trophy
2. Costume Class, Grades 8 and up ..... Trophy
3. 4-H Walk/Trot, Horse ..... Trophy
4. 4-H Walk/Trot, Pony ..... Trophy
5. Bareback – Horse Western/English ..... Trophy

**Lot**

1. A story, not more than 200 words, about a Horse Project activity you performed or participated in this past year.
2. A poster of a horse related subject (i.e. safety, grooming, nutrition, health), 11” x 14”
3. Poster showing a free hand drawing of a horse using any medium, 11” x 14”
4. Poster showing parts of a horse, 14” x 22”
5. Scrapbook or display about 10 breeds of horses (properly identified)
6. An exhibit of any other phase of the project.

Open to only those members enrolled in the Clothes Horse project.
