

**ATCP 160.56 - HORSE AND PONY – DEPARTMENT 6**  
**Judging: Tuesday, 8:30 a.m. – Infield of Race Track**

Regulations – See health regulations in front of book. Green County also requires vaccination for Eastern and Western equine encephalomyelitis, tetanus, influenza and coggins test. Your original coggins test and a copy needs to be presented before unloading at the fairgrounds. Check in with superintendents upon arrival.

**Horse and Pony Size Classification**

- a. Horse – 56 inches and over      b. Pony – under 56 inches

**Horse and Pony Rules and Instructions**

1. First year exhibitor (or) exhibitor/one horse/pony – Exhibitor may enter in **two** lots under the Danish system, including Showmanship, Reinsmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship, or Trail and in **one** Driving, English or Western lot under Regular judging.
2. One exhibitor/two horse/pony(s) – Exhibitor may enter in **two** lots under the Danish system, including Showmanship, Reinsmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship, or Trail and each horse/pony in **one** Driving, English, or Western lot under Regular judging.
3. Two exhibitors/one horse/pony – Two exhibitors from the same family may enter the same animal in two lots under the Danish system, including Showmanship, Reinsmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship, or Trail. **One** of the two exhibitors from the same family may also enter the animal in **one** Driving, English, or Western lot under Regular judging.
4. All exhibitors are to wear a safety approved helmet while on their horse/pony.
5. No stallions can be shown except foals of current year..
6. The rules as found in the American Horse Show Association rule book will govern the show as much as possible.
7. Blue ribbon winners, 12 years of age and older, as of January 1 of the exhibit year, are eligible to show in all classes at the State 4-H Horse Show. State Horse show qualifiers must register for the State Horse Show at the Extension Office no later than the day after the County Fair Horse Show.
8. It is recommended that members exhibiting that are in grades 8 and younger be accompanied by a parent or a responsible adult.

Judged on the exhibitor’s ability to show animal at halter.

**CLASS B - PLEASURE**  
(Regular Judging)

Animal judged on its performance as a pleasure mount or a pleasure drive.

1. Pleasure Driving Pony or Horse, any age, grade or registered
6. English Pleasure, Grades 3-6
7. English Pleasure, Grades 7-9
8. English Pleasure, Grades 10 and up
11. Western Pleasure Grades 3-6
12. Western Pleasure, Grades 7-9
13. Western Pleasure, Grades 10 and up

**CLASS C - HORSEMANSHIP**  
(Danish Judging)

Judged on the exhibitor’s ability to drive or ride.

1. Driving Reinsmanship Pony or Horse  
Champion Driving .....ribbon  
(Top blue from Lot 1)
5. English Equitation (Horsemanship), Grades 3-6
6. English Equitation (Horsemanship), Grades 7-9
7. English Equitation (Horsemanship), Grades 10 and up  
Champion English Equitation..... ribbon  
(Top blue from Lots 5-7)
10. Western Horsemanship, Grades 3-6
11. Western Horsemanship, Grades 7-9
12. Western Horsemanship, Grades 10 and up

Champion Western Horsemanship .....ribbon  
(Top blue from Lots 10-12)

**CLASS D – TRAIL CLASS**  
(Danish Judging)

1. Trail Class, Grades 3-6..... ribbon
2. Trail Class, Grades 7-9..... ribbon
3. Trail Class, Grades 10 and up..... ribbon

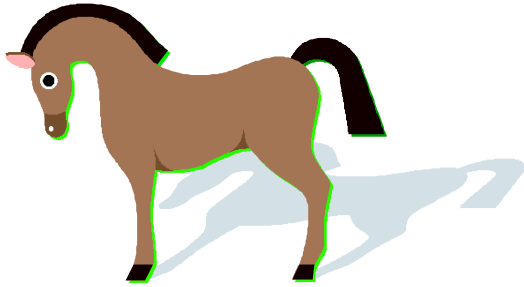
**CLASS E – COSTUME CLASS**

1. Grades 3-7 .....Trophy
2. Grades 8 and up .....Trophy

Champion English Pleasure/Equitation..... ribbon  
(Top blue from Class B - lots 6-8 and Class C – lots 5-7)

Champion Pleasure, Western Equitation/Horsemanship..... ribbon

(Top blue from Class B – lots 11-13 and Class C – lots 10-12)

Open to only those members enrolled in the Horseless Horse project.

Entries to be turned in to Department 10 – Animal/Veterinary Science area at fair.

#### Lot

1. A story, not more than 200 words, about a Horse Project activity you performed or participated in this past year.
2. A poster of a horse related subject (i.e. safety, grooming, nutrition, health), 11" x 14"
3. Poster showing a free hand drawing of a horse using any medium, 11" x 14"
4. Poster showing parts of a horse, 14" x 22"
5. Scrapbook or display about 10 breeds of horses (properly identified)
6. An exhibit of any other phase of the project.

#### CLOTHES HORSE

Open to only those members enrolled in the Clothes Horse project.

(Classes are listed under Equestrian Attire in Division 26 and will be judged with clothing projects the Saturday before fair at the Green County Justice Center Multi-Purpose Rooms.)
